# University of Bordeaux Centre for Learning French as a Foreign Language (DEFLE)

The DEFLE is a department of Bordeaux Montaigne University in Bordeaux specialised in teaching French to non French-speaking students.

The courses on offer and teaching methods used are closely linked to research in language didactics conducted at the university.

The DEFLE encourages dialogue and exchange between French-speaking cultures and specialises in inter-cultural education.

The DEFLE offers an ideally located working environment in the suburbs of Bordeaux, a city listed as a UNESCO world heritage site.

The region's world famous vineyards lie close by, as do the Atlantic coastline, Pyrenees Mountains and Spain beyond.

Each year the DEFLE plays host to approximately 1 000 students of varying nationalities on the university campus in Talence, Pessac and Gradignan, from students at the onset of their university education to experienced post-graduates.

All students benefit from our personalised mentoring scheme to help them through the registration process, accompanying and supporting them during their time with us.



### A Wide Range of Courses

#### **Day courses**

Training for a University Diploma qualification corresponding to CECR levels A1 to C2.

- Organised over one semester (either September to December or January to May), 15/16 hours per week over a 12 week period.
- Teaching is based on the four language skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- Teaching in higher levels addresses such specialities as - French for Specific Objectives (French for business, French for tourism, etc.) or French and French-speaking culture and civilisation (literature, theatre, music, art, cinema, etc.).

Fees: 950 €/semester

### **Evening courses**

Non-diploma courses. A transcript of grades achieved is delivered at the end of the course.

- Lessons take place on two evenings per week, 2 x 2 hrs 30 min, over a 10 week period during one semester (from September to December or February to the end of April), i.e. 50 hours per semester.
- Teaching is based on the four language skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Fees: 270 €/semester

#### **Summer courses**

4-week intensive courses: 20 hours of lessons per week during July.

• Students are divided into groups according to level of competence and teaching includes lessons in French language (4 skills) and French culture (literature, civilisation, music, etc.). A programme of cultural, sporting and recreational activities is also provided.

**Fees:** 650 €

#### **Teacher Training**

1 year course (approximately 220 hours) to prepare the DAEFLE university diploma in teaching French as a foreign language.

- Open to people with a bachelor's degree or equivalent.
- Admission is subjected to a selection procedure (application and interview).

Fees: 1200 € (a private individuel)

2000 € (financed by a public authority) 3000 € (financed by a private body)

An examination centre for certifications

The DEFLE is an examination centre for the DELF and DALF national diplomas for all 6 levels of the CECR:

- DELF A1, A2, B1, B2
- DALF C1, C2.

There are 3 exam sessions per year.
